Among the Union regiments at the battle of Chancellorsville was the Connecticut 14th Regiment.

In May 1862 the governor of Connecticut formed the 14th Regiment with Bridgeport's Dwight Morris as colonel and many Stratford men



among its 1,015
troops. Four months
later, Colonel Morris
said in his report
after the Battle of
Antietam: "The men
in my brigade were
all new troops,
hastily raised, and
without drill or
experience, and
although under fire

for the first time, behaved with great gallantry. In front of the position held by the 14th Connecticut more than 1,000 of the enemy lie slain." The 14th suffered 21 killed, 28 missing and 88 wounded. Among the dead was Hanford Curtis of Company A.

The 14th fought at Chancellorsville, where the band marched out between the Union and Confederate lines and played The Star Spangled Banner and Yankee Doodle.
